



Bin Basics and Recycling.

Bin Store Areas

Whether you have a communal bin store or bins are stored separately, they are for sole use of residents. Bulky waste such as mattresses, old furniture etc. should not be left by the bins as the cost of removal will be charged to all residents! It's worth knowing the number of your local council, as most will remove bulky items for a small fee.

Don't Invite Vermin In!

Over flowing bins are a welcome invitation to rats, foxes and other animals. All residents should do their best to ensure rubbish goes inside the bins. If you notice the bin collection has not happened on the normal day, phone your local council and report it so that it can be dealt with as soon as possible.

Household Waste

The household waste bin is for household waste only that cannot be recycled.

- **No glass**
- **No garden waste**
- **No bricks or rubble**

Recycling

Every council has their own rules on what can and cannot be recycled. If you are unsure, guidance can be found online. A few general rules:

- **All recycled materials are to be clean and food free**
- **Carrier bags are not recyclable**
- **All glass bottles or jars should be taken to the local bottle bank or put in the glass bin if it has been provided**

Garden Waste

Not all properties are issued receptacles for garden waste even though it cannot be put into the household waste bin. Most local councils provide a collection service, if not then it's your responsibility to take garden waste to your Local Household Waste Recycling Centre.
